Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since 24 day of July anno Domini 1910, and in the State of _____, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 1 day of April anno Domini 1915, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.
