TO THE GRAND LODGE OF ALABAMA.

DIRECTIONS.

1. If there is space enough in the blank for the Officers and Members of the Lodge, without the slip, it need not be used. If there is not, attach the slip (if not already attached,) with mucilage, or by some other means, at the proper place, and number regularly on, leaving out all who are dead, expelled, suspended, and dimitted, (which put in their proper places,) and include any who have been *Reinstated or Raised*.
2. If proxies go to the Grand Lodge instead of the officers, put a (*) after the names on their certificates to indicate that they are proxies.
3. Dues are to be paid for *all* members except for Ministers of the Gospel *in charge of churches*, or ministers disabled by infirmity. None other are exempted. And the dues are always FIFTY CENTS for each member of every chartered lodge, unless otherwise ordered.
4. In making out returns, date from the 15th day of September of the past year to 14th of September of the current year, inclusive.
5. Put the seal in the place indicated by the circle, and be careful to have it upright.
6. Be careful to fill up all the blanks in the Returns, and if there is nothing to fill up with, write the word *none* in the blank, so that the Committee may know that the absence of anything is not an oversight.
7. Secretaries of Subordinate Lodges should read carefully the Constitution of the Grand Lodge, and the reports of the proceedings; and especially the reports of the Grand Secretary and Committees on Chartered Lodges, that they may see what errors to avoid; and carefully observe all headings and blanks in the Returns. *And Masters of Lodges should see that the Returns are full and correct before they sign them.*
8. Opposite the name of a member who is exempt from the payment of dues by reason of being a *minister in charge of one or more churches*, put the letters M. G.
9. Be careful to fill up properly the memorandums on the inside under the Heads of "Dues" and "Fees"
10. Fill up nothing with a pencil. Everything must be done with ink. Give the whole of the name, and not the initials merely, *nor an abbreviation.*
11. The Grand Secretary begs that Secretaries of Subordinate Lodges will be careful to put down the post-office to which they wish communications to be directed. And to mail their communications at their own post-office. *This is very important.*
12. Be careful to put down the names of all those who have been *reinstated* since the last return.
13. The Secretary of every Lodge ought to take pride in having his returns reported *correct*, and also without blot, or blemish, or erasure. And it can easily be accomplished if he will fill up the blanks with that care and attention that he ought to bestow.
14. On the page of "Degrees Conferred," and under the head of "Master Masons," put the names of those who have been Raised since last Return, and the date; and also the date of receiving either of the other degrees. And observe—one who is now reported as a Master Mason, must not be reported under the head of "Fellow-Crafts," or "Entered Apprentices." And one who is now reported as a Fellow-Craft, must not be reported under the head of Entered Apprentices.
15. Under the head of "Fellow-Crafts and Entered Apprentices heretofore reported," put the names of those who have not advanced since last return, if they are still within the jurisdiction of the Lodge. But if they have already been reported for two successive years, either as Fellow-Crafts or Entered Apprentices, their names may be dropped from these returns.
16. Lodges under Dispensation are not required to have a Seal or to pay Dues; but every *Chartered* Lodge is required by the Constitution to have a Seal.
17. If one is *suspended for non-payment of dues* and then *reinstated* during the same masonic year, his name need not be put under either of those heads.
18. Never improvise a blank. Should the Secretary not happen to have one, write to the Grand Secretary.

Secretaries will attend carefully to all directions on this sheet.

THE REGULAR ANNUAL COMMUNICATIONS

Of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Alabama and its Masonic Jurisdiction are held at the Masonic Temple, in the City of Montgomery, on the first Tuesday in December of each and every year, commencing at seven o'clock in the evening; and on the morning and evening of every day thereafter until closed; and the Masters and Wardens of the Subordinate Chartered Lodges, Working under its Jurisdiction, or their proxies, are members of it.

No one can represent any Lodge other than that of which he is a member; and before he can act as a representative, the Dues of his Lodge must be paid.

Dues are payable to the Grand Lodge for each officer and member of the Subordinate Chartered Lodges, except ministers who have the superintendence or pastoral charge of one or more churches; or ministers of any denomination who are prevented from preaching by disease or infirmity contracted while actually engaged in the ministry. There is no other exemption either on account of age or infirmity.
