## PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States, Northern District of Illinois:

The petition of ABRAHAM MELAMED; hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 1530 S. Springfield Ave., Chicago, Illinois.

Second. My occupation is Finner & Copper Smith

Third. I was born on the 11th day of July, anno Domini 1 865 at Mozar, Russia

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Quebec, Canada, on or about the 11th day of September

anno Domini 1 912, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Detroit, Mich., on the 12th day of September

anno Domini 912, on the vessel C. P. Ry.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 25th day of July, anno Domini 1 922

at Chicago, Ill., in the Circuit Court of Cook County

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Mary; she was born on the - day of -, anno Domini 1 -

at Russia, and now resides at with me, Chicago, Illinois.

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The State of Russia

of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 12th day of September, anno Domini 1 912 and in the State of Illinois, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 13th day of September, anno Domini 1 902, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I ~~was previously naturalized~~ to the - Court of - at -, on the - day of -, anno Domini 1 -, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, - and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
