PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the District Court of the United States, Northern District of Illinois:

The petition of SOL MILLER Formerly SHULEM MELAMED, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 3336 W. 26th St., (Give number and street.) Chicago, Illinois.

Second. My occupation is Cap Maker

Third. I was born on the 22nd day of December, anno Domini 1 896, at Mosir, Russia

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Quebec, Canada, on or about the 11th day of September

anno Domini 1 912, and arrived in the United States, at the port of Detroit, Michigan, on the 12th day of September

anno Domini 1 912, on the vessel Canadian Pacific RR

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 11th day of November, anno Domini 1 920

at Chicago, Illinois in the Circuit Court of Cook County

Sixth. I am married. My (wife's) name is Ida, (she) was born on the 5th day of July, anno Domini 1 903

at New York City, N.Y. and now resides at with me, (Give number and street.) Chicago, Illinois

I have 1 child~~ren~~ and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The State of Russia, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 12th day of September, anno Domini 1 912, and in the State of Illinois, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 13th day of September, anno Domini 1 912, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. ~~XXXXXX~~ Court of XXXXXX at XXXXXX, on the XXXXXX day of XXXXXX, anno Domini 1 XXXXXX, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, XXXXXX, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.
